Le Roi Community Foundation Grant Application - Guidelines for Grant Seekers

Purpose

The Le Roi Community Foundation is committed to improving the quality of life in the communities of Fruitvale, Montrose, Trail, Warfield, Rossland and Areas A and B of the Regional District of Kootenay Boundary through the distribution of income from its ever-growing pool of permanent endowment funds. These funds have been established through the generosity of donors who have chosen to contribute to the support of our local communities.

Eligibility

The Le Roi Community Foundation invites applications for eligible projects sponsored by **registered charities or other qualified donees*** that provide services to residents of its geographical area. Eligible projects shall advance the charitable purposes of the Le Roi Community Foundation as defined in its Constitution.

- * Important Note: Under federal law, the Le Roi Community Foundation can only accept applications from *qualified donees* as defined by Revenue Canada. Such organizations will have a Revenue Canada Charitable Registration Number. Applicants must either have their own number or be sponsored by another group/organization with one. If you are using another group's number you must include a letter from them, with your application, indicating their agreement to sponsor your application. Under the *Income Tax Act* qualified donees must be one of the following:
- a registered charity (including a registered national arts service organization);
- a registered Canadian amateur athletic association;
- a listed housing corporation resident in Canada constituted exclusively to provide low-cost housing for the aged;
- a listed Canadian municipality;
- a listed municipal or public body performing a function of government in Canada.

Areas of Interest

Eligible projects that further the goals of the Le Roi Community Foundation include, but are not limited to, charitable activities in any of the following fields of interest:

- Arts and Culture
- Education
- Environment
- Health and Welfare
- Sports and Recreation

Funding Cycle & Disbursements

The Le Roi Community Foundation currently welcomes applications for **one (1) grant cycle per year.**

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Priorities

In awarding grants, particular consideration is given to innovative projects that engage in one or more of the following activities:

- Capital projects
- Action-oriented research and innovation
- Build effective partnerships
- Realize a significant and sustainable result with a moderate amount of funding
- Contribute to strengthening the community, especially by encouraging the participation of diverse groups and individuals

Funding Restrictions

The Le Roi Community Foundation does not support:

- Organizational operating funding* (which includes wages)
- Deficit reduction
- Retroactive funding
- Fund-raising campaigns
- Exclusively travel focused activities
- Academic and scientific research
- Scholarships**
- Individuals
- Sponsorship of sports and recreation, team or club
- * except for new organizations providing programs in emerging and high priority service areas of specific interest to the LeRoi Foundation
- ** except for funds specifically endowed for this purpose

The Application Process

- The Le Roi Community Foundation invites interested applicants to submit their grant application by the specified date.
- Successful applicants will be notified by letter. Successful applicants will be expected to sign a letter of agreement and <u>provide a</u>
 <u>follow-up report within one year</u>. Grants provided must be used within one year of the date of receiving the funds.
- If successful applicants have received funding and the project for which the funds were provided is unable to proceed, <u>all funds</u> awarded must be returned to the Le Roi Community
 Foundation. Should funds be dispersed on expenses unrelated to the funded project, the organization is responsible for reimbursement to the Le Roi Community Foundation.

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
